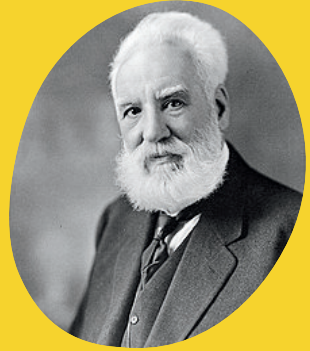


Graham Bell
